### **Section 3: Hazards Identification**

Appearance: clear, colorless liquid.

**Danger!** Reacts violently and/or explosively with water, steam or moisture. Causes eye, skin, and respiratory tract irritation. May cause allergic respiratory and skin reaction.

### **Potential Health Effects**

**Eye:** Causes eye irritation. Lachrymator (substance which increases the flow of tears). When substance becomes wet or comes in contact with moisture of the mucous membranes, it will cause irritation. May cause chemical conjunctivitis.

**Skin:** May cause skin sensitization, an allergic reaction, which becomes evident upon re-exposure to this material. Contact with skin causes irritation and possible burns, especially if the skin is wet or moist.

Ingestion: May cause gastrointestinal irritation with nausea, vomiting and diarrhea.

Inhalation: Causes respiratory tract irritation. Can produce delayed pulmonary edema. May

cause respiratory sensitization.

Chronic: Effects may be delayed.

#### Section 4: First Aid Measures
